

# MY VOTE MY RIGHTS

Useful information for voters who are trans, non-binary or without a fixed address

## YOUR ID



To vote, you need one piece of ID showing your name and qualifying Toronto address.

Your voting ID does not need to have your photo or gender marker.

For example: utility bills, educational transcripts, etc – in print or digital form.

## YOUR ADDRESS



If you do not have a permanent address, the place you go most often to sleep or eat in the last 5 weeks will be considered your residence.

For example: a shelter, drop-in centre or any location in the city. It can even be an intersection.

If you let the voting place staff know that you do not have a fixed address, you are not required to provide identification as your declaration of identity will be enough.

To be added to the voters' list, you will have to complete a form using your temporary address that includes a declaration of identity.

## YOUR SAFETY

If you feel that your designated voting location is not a safe space for you, you have other choices, including **proxy voting** or **ballot transfer**.



### Proxy Voting

You may appoint another eligible elector to vote on your behalf by completing and submitting a Proxy Appointment Form.

If you encounter a barrier at your designated voting place, you can vote at another location within your ward by making a Ballot Transfer Request.
